## SHROVE TUESDAY

### A.G.M. (East and West)

On Tuesday, March 1st, the Annual General Meeting of the Parish will be held at St. John the Baptist Church Hall at 7-30 p.m. The agenda will include the election of Churchwardens, a review by the Vicar on the work of the past year, including plans for the future; a financial report, and the election of the Parochial Church Council for the next 12 months.

As this will be Shrove Tuesday, refreshments will be served, and every effort made to see that this important meeting is a happy social occasion.

## SPORTS GROUND

### A START THIS SPRING

The Council has approved the plans, loan sanction has been obtained from the Ministry, and tenders are now being sought for the £10,500 project of the Ermine Recreation Ground off Woodhall Drive.

### Pavilion and Swings

The first task will be to erect the five feet high metal railings round the site, and the work of levelling can then begin.

A Sports Pavilion and public lavatories will be erected off Sudbrooke Drive, and adjacent to them will be a car park and Children's Playground. The children will have the traditional and much loved amusements of slide, four swings, see-saw, merry-go-round and ocean wave.

### Variety of Pitches

Lying off Woodhall Drive will be the main Senior Football Pitch, 105 x 65 yds., and on either side of it

will be the main Cricket Table, and a secondary cricket pitch.

On the Laughton Way side of the field there will be the four hard tennis courts and the hard surface for Netball. Three other areas will be marked out, one 80 x 50 for Organised Games, another 100 x 55 for Senior Hockey or Junior Football and the third 90 x 55 for Junior Football or Junior Hockey.

### Bowling Green

In an interview with Mr. Adlington, the City Engineer, who kindly made the above details available, the Vicar asked why there was no provision for a bowling green for the older members of the community. Mr. Adlington replied that the Recreation Ground was primarily intended for children but that a bowling green might be built on the site off Ravendale Drive, although no definite plan had been made for this area as yet.
