St. John's becomes a Parish

Extract from the *London Gazette*:

"At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 26th Oct., 1960, present The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council . . . we, the Church Commissioners humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the scheme for constituting a new parish, St. John the Baptist Lincoln."

To commemorate the forming of the new parish the Bishop of Lincoln will be the Celebrant at the Family Communion at St. John the Baptist on Sunday, January 15th, at 9 a.m.

BISHOP GIVES "GO AHEAD"

A further grant of £5,000 from the Church Commissioners has been made towards the building of St. John's Parish Church, and the Bishop of Lincoln has encouraged us to go ahead and start building. There is a lot of money still to be raised, and 1961 will need to see a big effort throughout the Parish. The plans so far have raised widespread interest and acclaim, and when the P.C.C. have approved the final details you may well see pictures of your parish church on T.V. and in the daily press. More details next month, but please remember in your prayers all who are concerned in the planning and preparation of this work for God's glory.

Change of Name

Now that we are a parish, St. John's House will become St. John's Vicarage, and the Asst. Curate's bungalow will take over the name St. John's House.

The bungalow is rapidly nearing completion but it may not be quite ready for January 3rd, when Fr. Bill is to be married to Miss Jenny Collinson at Dulwich College Chapel, London. However they propose to live in a caravan on the church site until they can move in.

All at St. John's offer them their congratulations and good wishes, and we would like to offer a warm welcome to Mrs. Brockie as she comes to live amongst us.

Confirmation 1961

The Rt. Rev. the Dean of Lincoln will be taking a Confirmation Service at St. John's on Saturday, March 18th at 7-30 p.m.

Besides the many adults and teenagers who have already given in their names there are many people who would like to know about it all before they commit themselves. There are also many others who are already confirmed, but would like to attend a "Revision" course.

To meet all these needs a course of instruction will be given at the Evening Service at St. John the Baptist on Sundays at 6-30. The first of these services will be on January 15th. At this service there will be a printed syllabus of the whole course, and printed notes will also be issued each evening. After each service there will be a cup of tea and the opportunity to ask questions and to join a discussion group. The clergy will also be available during the week for personal interviews and instruction.

Start at the beginning—Jan. 15th, at 6-30 p.m.
